2. Theological Foundations: 3. Character

Character

- **Definition** Character is the balance of a person's qualities, speech, and behavior.
- **Standard** The standard of Christian character is found in the Scriptures and the person of Jesus.
- Universal Mandate God gives various gifts and callings to His children, but character is His universal mandate.
- **Totality of Consistent Conduct** Character includes repentance and obedience, yet it is the totality of one's consistent conduct.

Character

"Character" in the New Testament (ESV) comes from the Greek word dokimē, which contains the idea of testing to prove genuineness. Character is tested by God, circumstances, ourselves, and others. God builds a Christian's character over time, developing one's whole life to conform to the image of Christ.

Romans 5:3-5 - Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character (*dokimēn*), and character (*dokimēn*) produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.





Character Needed for All Christians



Psalm 24 - The earth is the LORD's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein, ² for he has founded it upon the seas and established it upon the rivers. ³ Who shall ascend the hill of the LORD? And who shall stand in his holy place?

Psalm 24 (cont'd) - ⁴ He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false and does not swear deceitfully.⁵ He will receive blessing from the LORD and righteousness from the God of his salvation.⁶ Such is the generation of those who seek him, who seek the face of the God of Jacob.⁷ Lift up your heads, O gates! He who does these things shall never be moved.

Galatians 5:16-24 But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

Hebrews 12:12-17 - Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed. Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no "root of bitterness" springs up and causes trouble, and by it many become defiled; that no one is sexually immoral or unholy like Esau, who sold his birthright for a single meal. For you know that afterward, when he desired to inherit the blessing, he was rejected, for he found no chance to repent, though he sought it with tears.



Matthew 25:31-35 - When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. And he will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left. Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food...'



2 Peter 1:3-12 - His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire. For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.



2 Peter 1:3-12 (cont'd) - For whoever lacks these qualities is so nearsighted that he is blind, having forgotten that he was cleansed from his former sins. Therefore, brothers, be all the more diligent to confirm your calling and election, for if you practice these qualities you will never fall. For in this way there will be richly provided for you an entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

2 Timothy 2:20-21 - Now in ia great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver but also of wood and clay, some for honorable use, some for dishonorable. Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from what is dishonorable, he will be a vessel for honorable use, set apart as holy, useful to the master of the house, ready for every good work.




Philippians 2:22 - But you know Timothy's **proven worth** (*dokimēn*), how as a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel.

1 Timothy 3:10 - And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless.


Galatians 6:4 - But let each one **test his own work**, and then his reason to boast will be in himself alone and not in his neighbor.

1 Corinthians 12:31 - 13:3 - But earnestly desire the higher gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.



1 Corinthians 13:8 - 14:1 - Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known. So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love. Pursue love, and earnestly desire the spiritual gifts, especially that you may prophesy.

John 15:4 - I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.

Character Makes One Fruitful More Than Spiritual Gifts Do



Matthew 7:21-27 - "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; **depart from me, you workers** of lawlessness.'"

Character, Not Gifts, Builds One's Relationship with the Lord

Matthew 7:21-27 (cont'd) - "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."



Character Pleases God and Can Attract His Gifts



Numbers 12:6-9 - And he said, "Hear my words: If there is a prophet among you, I the LORD make myself known to him in a vision; I speak with him in a dream. ⁷ Not so with my servant Moses. **He is faithful in all my house.** ⁸ With him I speak mouth to mouth, clearly, and not in riddles, and he beholds the form of the LORD. Why then were you not afraid to speak against my servant Moses?" ⁹ And the anger of the LORD was kindled against them, and he departed.

Character Pleases God and Can Attract His Gifts

1 Samuel 9:2 - And he had a son whose name was Saul, a handsome young man. There was not a man among the people of Israel more handsome than he. From his shoulders upward he was taller than any of the people.

1 Samuel 13:14 - "But now your kingdom shall not continue. The LORD has sought out a man after his own heart, and the LORD has commanded him to be prince over his people, because you have not kept what the LORD commanded you."

God Looks for Character Rather Than Gifts

1 Samuel 16:6-7 - When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the LORD's anointed is before him." But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the LORD sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart."

God Looks for Character Rather Than Gifts

Wrong American Perspective - Today's celebrity culture, including church culture, wrongly values giftedness over character. This ungodly perspective has harmed the church, especially in America.

Character Over Giftedness - Christians must prioritize godly character over powerful giftedness, while still earnestly desiring the more impactful spiritual gifts.

Character Over Great Communication - Godly character is more important than being a "great communicator!"



Character Exceeds Giftedness

1 Timothy 3:1-7 - The saying is trustworthy: **If anyone aspires to the office of** overseer, he desires a noble task. Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil.

Titus 1:5-9 - This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you—if anyone is above reproach, the husband of one wife, and his children are believers and not open to the charge of debauchery or insubordination. For an overseer, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it.





James 3:1 - Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness.



- **Character Qualifies Leaders** The only qualification not related to one's character is the ability to teach.
- Character Qualities Especially Needed Today for Leaders
 - Self-Sacrifice putting in great effort to seek God and advance the kingdom
 - Keeping One's Word honoring commitments, even when and especially when it's difficult
 - **Courage** bold in speaking and acting for God's truth despite opposition from other Christians and from those outside the church

Leaders of Self-Sacrifice

Proverbs 18:9 - Whoever is slack in his work is a brother to him who destroys.

Proverbs 19:15 - Slothfulness casts into a deep sleep, and an idle person will suffer hunger.

1 Corinthians 15:10-11 - But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, **I worked harder than any of them**, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me.



Leaders of Self-Sacrifice

2 Timothy 2:3-6 - Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him. An athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules. It is the hard-working farmer who ought to have the first share of the crops.

2 Corinthians 4:7-12 - We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you.



Leaders Who Keep Their Word

Psalm 15:4 - "...who swears to his own hurt and does not change..."

Proverbs 20:6 - Many a man proclaims his own steadfast love, but a faithful man who can find?

Proverbs 20:25 - It is a snare to say rashly, "It is holy," and to reflect only after making vows.

James 5:12 - But above all, my brothers, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath, but let your "yes" be yes and your "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation.

Leaders Who Are Courageous

Proverbs 21:22 - A **wise man scales the city of the mighty** and brings down the stronghold in which they trust.

Deuteronomy 31:23 - And the LORD commissioned Joshua the son of Nun and said, "**Be strong and courageous**, for you shall bring the people of Israel into the land that I swore to give them. I will be with you."

2 Timothy 1:6-7 - For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.

Matthew 24:11-13 - And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.

Luke 21:34-36 - But watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life, and that day come upon you suddenly like a trap. For it will come upon all who dwell on the face of the whole earth. But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.

2 Timothy 3:1-5 - But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people.





2 Timothy 4:3-5 - For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.



- The Last Days Are Now and Not Yet To an extent, we are living in the last days now (Heb 1:2; 1 John 2:18).
- Intensification Will Come The last days will reach their fulfillment, intensifying their promised difficulties.
- Lawlessness and Persecution The primary difficulties of the last days include persecution and erosion of Christian character.
- Extremely Watchful Because Christian character will deteriorate even more over time, Christians should take extra care to watch their hearts and conduct.
